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Eats Around Zurich: Layover Edition

While on our whirlwind adventure of a pre-wedding honeymoon, we had a couple layovers in Zurich, Switzerland. Beautiful,

pristine, and with all the efficiency and hospitality that only the Swiss-Germen can conjure, Zurich bookended our trip around Europe due to some favorable flight deals. On our way in we spent 6 hours around the city center before skipping off to London, but on the way back we spent 2 days strolling the streets and soaking our tired feet. A word of warning, Zurich is not a cheap city, so be mindful of where you are headed before you go. Nevertheless, it is safe and fun. Here's what we did there:

Where We Stayed:



Certainly, the main highlight of our time in Zurich came at the end of our trip. With our 2 days at the end of our journey, we stayed at the B2 Boutique Hotel and Spa, a gem of a spot steeped in both history and hot water (literally). The B2 Hotel was constructed out of the Hurlimann brewery, one of the premiere breweries of Switzerland founded in 1836. Don't assume it's only silos and water wheels, though, the B2 hosts a beautiful modern interior with extremely hospitable staff and amenities. And if modern hospitality, rich history, and high caliber in-house dining aren't enough for you, fear not! While staying at the hotel you are free to access the Thermal Baths and heated rooftop pool on sight! While we weren't able to take

any photos (phones aren't allowed in the spa) we spent numerous hours soaking away the many miles we had walked on our trip. This was the only hotel of our trip, and boy was it a magical experience.

The B2 Hotel is just outside the city center of Zurich. We recommend either taking a train into the Zurich HB (main station) and grabbing a quick tram ride, if you want to explore the city a little, or take a train directly from the airport (Flughafen) to Zurich Enge and it's only about 5 minutes on foot. Don't forget to enjoy the scenery while you're heading to the hotel!



What We Did (part 1):

Our time in Zurich was somewhat brief, but we were able to have a little fun while we were there. Starting with our first layover, we landed in Zurich at around 8am on a Sunday. Things were quite, and we were very jetlagged, but we opted to head into the city center and explore. We had some amazing

hot chocolate and walked around the alleyways and Fraumunster and Grossmunster Churches. We had lunch with some artillery (no really) before heading off to London.

We found our way into a bathhouse that becomes a beer garden at night, and took a stroll by the water to get some ice cream.
